## Late Starts

Late starts cannot be facilitated at our hospital. Successful applicants are required to orientate and commence work at the start of the House Officer training year in January.

## Vocational Training

- Rural Hospital Medicine Training (Emergency Dept RNZCGP – RHMTTP accredited)
- Basic Surgical Training (Dept. RACS accredited) and SET Trainee Post (RACS accredited)
- Basic Training (Dept. RACP accredited) and Advanced Trainee Post (RACP accredited)
- Paediatric Advanced Trainee Post (RACP accredited)

## Regular House Officer Teaching

- Weekly Protected PGY1 HO Teaching (1hr)
- Weekly Protected PGY2 HO Teaching (1 hr) Can also include Dept. Registrar teaching
- Weekly Grand Rounds
- Departmental Teaching (journal clubs, department grand rounds etc. and daily 1:1 teaching)

## Rosters

Rosters vary across the specialties, however to give you an idea on average you will work:

- Safe Hours Rostering – No nights at all in 1st year (at this stage)
- 10 days on and 4 days off (when working full weekends)
- PGY1 Roster 2.5 weekends and 11 evening shifts (per HO quarter)

## PGY1 Average

Union dependent, but majority on STONZ – Category D (50-54.9) Yr. 1 = \$92,200pa.
